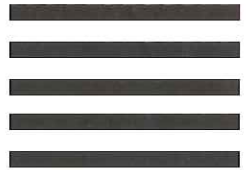

# Texas Is Falling Far Behind

- Texas' population is increasing by 1,100 persons each day.
- An annual investment of \$10.8 billion is needed to maintain 2010 road and bridge conditions.
- In 2016, there will be only \$2.9 billion available for new highways and road maintenance.

# Poor Highways Risk Lives



- In 2013, 9 Texans a day lost their lives due to traffic accidents.
- 800 Texans a day were injured on our roads and highways.

## Proposition 1 Will Reduce Traffic Congestion

- Texans in metropolitan areas are wasting almost 40 hours per year stuck in traffic.
- In 15 years, that number will double.

Will Provide An Additional \$1.4 Billion Annually For Highways.

## Proposition 1 Will Create More Jobs

- An estimated 30,000 construction jobs are created per \$1 billion in spending.
- For every \$1 spent on transportation, \$6 in economic benefit is received.
